Matthias Maute, Faculty

Matthias Maute is known internationally as a conductor, recorder and flute player, and composer. He is co-artistic director of Ensemble Caprice, which performs at major festivals world wide. He won first prize in the soloist category at the renowned Early Music Competition in Bruges, Belgium in 1990 and made his debut at Lincoln Center in New York in 2008. He has been the featured recorder soloist at the Boston Early Music Festival. Many of his contemporary recorder music compositions are widely performed and were published by Breitkopf & Härtel, Amadeus, Moeck and Carus. He has made numerous recordings on the Analekta, Vanguard Classics, Bella Musica, Dorian, Bridge and Atma Classique labels. He teaches at Université de Montréal and McGill University in Montreal.

Sophie Larivière, Faculty

Sophie Larivière, Artistic Co-Director of Ensemble Caprice, has performed with the ensemble in Europe, Israel, Canada and the United States (including at the Boston Early Music Festival). She has performed with other early music ensembles such as the Arion Ensemble, the Opéra de Montréal, Le Studio de musique ancienne de Montréal, La Nouvelle Sinfonie, the Theatre of Early Music, Rebel (New York), Les Violons du Roy (Quebec), the New York Collegium Musicum and Le Concert Spirituel (Paris). She has made recordings on the Analekta, Virgin Classics, Atma Classique, Antes Edition and Interdisc labels. She lives with her husband, Matthias Maute, and two children in Montreal, Quebec.

Directions: By Road/Water Taxi: Take a scenic ferry ride from the mainland at Tsawassen or Horseshoe Bay to Nanaimo. Drive north on Hwy 19, the main island highway, and turn off just past marker 320 onto an unpaved logging road marked Zeballos/Fair Harbour. At Fair Harbour, board your reserved water taxi for a magnificent 30-minute boat ride through mountainous waterways to Kyuquot.

Places to stay along the way: We recommend that you spend one overnight on your way to Kyuquot. 
